Supreme Court Appoints New Court Administrator

The Vermont Supreme Court is pleased to announce the appointment of Robert Greemore of Barre Town as Court Administrator.

Mr. Greemore was chosen after a thorough search process by the Court. Chief Justice Paul Reiber expressed his appreciation for the professionalism and thoroughness of the confidential search process, which attracted more than 40 candidates from within and beyond the State of Vermont and included two rounds of interviews as well as visits with several court system offices and staff. In the words of Chief Justice Reiber, “the Vermont Judiciary stands on the cusp of historic change as we face protracted state budget shortfalls for the foreseeable future. We are pleased to appoint such a creative and committed leader for the challenging years ahead.”

Born in Colchester, Robert Greemore is a life-long resident of Vermont. He is a graduate of the University of Vermont (B.S. 1971). Prior to joining the court system in 1979, he provided staff support to several state commissions and served as the Executive Director of the Vermont State’s Attorneys and Sheriffs from 1975 to 1979. He has served as the Director of Administrative Services of the Vermont Judiciary since 1979. In that role, he was responsible for the Judicial Branch budget, employment and labor law policies, court facilities, court security, and a number of other important areas.

Mr. Greemore is married to Lenora Greemore and has a daughter and son. He is a volunteer for youth hockey.
