**WINDSOR COUNTY STANDING ORDER RE: IN PERSON AND WEBEX  
HEARINGS FOR DOMESTIC, CHINS, AND RELIEF FROM ABUSE MATTERS**

Parties, counsel, and witnesses shall appear as follows for hearings:

**IN PERSON – DOMESTIC**

All evidentiary hearings (temporary or final)  
All CONTESTED hearings (temporary or final)

**REMOTE - DOMESTIC**

Status Conferences (both video & audio on)  
All uncontested hearings (both video & audio on)

**IN PERSON - JUVENILE**

All evidentiary hearings  
  
All CONTESTED hearings

**REMOTE - JUVENILE**

All uncontested hearings (both video & audio on)

**RELIEF FROM ABUSE**

Attorneys, clients, and witnesses may appear either in person or remotely. If a client appears in person, however, the attorney shall also appear in person, absent approval by the court in advance of the hearing. If appearing remotely via WebEx, both video and audio shall be on.

If you wish to appear remotely at a hearing requiring in person appearance, please review Rule 43.1 of the Vermont Rules of Civil Procedure prior to filing a motion to appear remotely.

If you wish to appear in person for a hearing that is scheduled to be held remotely, please contact the court at least two days in advance to ensure in person appearance can be accommodated at the hearing.

Please remember that WebEx is a virtual courtroom. Accordingly, proper attire, decorum, and conduct is expected from all participants. No food, beverages (other than water), or gum allowed. Your background can be adjusted on WebEx. No witnesses shall be present on WebEx with any party until after the witness has testified.

Exhibits which you intend to use in your case in chief shall be filed with the court (and copies provided to the other side) at least 7 days prior to the hearing date **for both in person and remote hearings**. Failure to do so could result in the court excluding them from consideration. The court understands there will be times when an exhibit may be offered at the time of the hearing without being pre-filed. However, this should be the exception, not the rule.
