## DELIVERY OF COURT DOCUMENTS BY E-MAIL

Supreme Court Administrative Order No. 45, § 4, authorizes the Court Administrator to sign a directive allowing the Supreme Court to send designated types of documents to lawyers and other specified persons by electronic mail (e-mail). The directive must specify the types of documents that will be delivered by e-mail and the date on which e-mail delivery will begin.

In exercise of that authority, the Supreme Court is directed to send hearing calendars, entry orders, and opinions by e-mail delivery to all attorneys with cases in the Supreme Court. Any such e-mail deliveries to attorneys will use the e-mail addresses that the attorneys have registered pursuant to Supreme Court Administrative Order No. 44. The Supreme Court may also send hearing calendars, entry orders, and opinions by e-mail delivery to self-represented litigants with cases in the Supreme Court who have agreed to receive the designated documents by e-mail and have registered at least one e-mail pursuant to Rule 3 of the Vermont Rules for Electronic Filing.

This directive becomes effective on September 3, 2013.
